Wonderland Presets accomplish just that. Why spend hours moving sliders trying to achieve the amazing looks that you love. Apply them in a second! This is a collection of my favorite presets. It represents over two years of moving sliders back and forth in the creative process known as the digital darkroom. It's not enough to be a professional photographer anymore. In this digital age we must become photographic technicians. My personal goal is to spend more time behind my lens and less time in front of my computer. Wonderland Presets help me to achieve that goal on a daily basis. That's what I call efficiency.

How to Install Presets

- Before you begin You have downloaded your presets and have extracted them to a folder on your hard drive. To "extract" you need only to double click on the "zipped" file that you downloaded from wonderland presets.
- You have noted the location of the wonderland presets folder that you downloaded and extracted (unzipped).
- Open lightroom and click on develop or press d
- Once in the develop module:
- Expand the "presets" module on the left by clicking on the triangle next to the word "presets."
- Right click on any of the "presets" sub-folders and select "new folder"
- A window will appear where you can name your new folder.
- Type "wonderland presets" and select the "create" button.
- Left click on the new wonderland folder to select it.
- Now right click (pc) or control click (mac) on the wonderland folder and select import.
- Browse your hard drive for the (unzipped) wonderland presets files. Select all that you want to import.
- After selection is made press "open" and presets will appear in lightroom ready to use.
